RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE MORIAH CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, ESSEX COUNTY, NEW YORK, BE AND HEREBY IS, AUTHORIZED:

TO EXPEND THE SUM OF \$ 22,237,254

PROPOSITION #1

SHALL THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE MORIAH CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT BE AUTHORIZED TO PURCHASE AND FINANCE ONE (1) DIESEL 66-PASSENGER SCHOOL BUS, ONE (1) ELECTRIC SCHOOL BUS WITH WHEELCHAIR LIFT AND ONE (1) GASOLINE SUV TYPE VEHICLE FOR STUDENT TRANSPORTATION, INCLUDING NECESSARY FURNISHINGS, FIXTURES AND EQUIPMENT AND ALL OTHER COSTS INCIDENTAL THERETO, AND EXPEND A TOTAL SUM NOT TO EXCEED \$723,589, WHICH IS ESTIMATED TO BE THE TOTAL MAXIMUM COST THEREOF, AND PAY FOR SUCH VEHICLES BY APPLYING \$265,250 IN AVAILABLE GRANT FUNDING FROM THE NEW YORK SCHOOL BUS INCENTIVE PROGRAM AND, FOR THE BALANCE, BY THE LEVY OF A TAX UPON THE TAXABLE PROPERTY OF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT AND COLLECTED IN ANNUAL INSTALLMENTS AS PROVIDED BY SECTION 416 OF THE EDUCATION LAW; AND, IN ANTICIPATION OF SUCH TAX, OBLIGATIONS OF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT, IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$458,339, SHALL BE ISSUED?
